But when Yom Tov falls on Friday, one may prepare for Shabbat on Yom Tov if one symbolically began the preparations before Yom Tov. This symbolic preparation is known as an Eruv Tavshilin. Every household must set aside one baked and one cooked item; usually on Pesach an egg and a matzah are used and the blessing of "al mitzvat eruv" is recited and the items are held in the hand. Full details are in the Pesach Machzor. <b>Omer:</b> 5 <sup>th</sup> Day
