This is a programme of readings and kinnot for parents of young children who may have been home with children while spouses have been in shul and now want an opportunity to switch. Tisha B'Av Programme – Tuesday Evening

Esther Bentley will be chairing our Tisha B'Av programme which will begin with Mincha at 7pm and will be followed at 7:30pm by the film "May Your Memory Be Love" - the story of Ovadia Baruch. At 8:15pm we are honoured to have as our speaker Renee Salt. Renee lives in North London and has five grandchildren. She regularly speaks in schools about her experiences during the Holocaust. Following the programme there will be Maariv at 9pm.

Film: In March 1943, twenty-year-old Ovadia Baruch was deported together with his family from Greece to Auschwitz-Birkenau. Upon arrival, his extended family was sent to the gas chambers. Ovadia struggled to survive until his liberation from the Mauthausen concentration camp in May 1945. While in Auschwitz, Ovadia met Aliza Tzarfati, a young Jewish woman from his hometown, and the two developed a loving relationship despite inhuman conditions. This film depicts their remarkable, touching story of love and survival in Auschwitz, a miraculous meeting after the Holocaust and the home they built together in Israel. This film is part of the "Witnesses and Education" project, a joint production of the International School for Holocaust Studies and the Multimedia Centre of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

Speaker: Renee was born in Poland in 1929 into a large, wellknown, extended family. Her father was an accountant and she enjoyed a comfortable, Orthodox lifestyle. In 1942, she was sent with her family to live in the Lodz ghetto. In 1944, they were taken by cattle trucks to Aushwitz-Birkenau. In 1945, as the allies advanced, concentration camps were evacuated and Renee found herself on her way to Bergen-Belsen where she was finally liberated. Renee's story can be found in "Survival: Holocaust Survivors tell their Story," published by the Holocaust Centre, and in the BBC Documentary "Grandchild of the Holocaust."
