 Details of our Tisha B'Av programme (21-22 July) are on our poster on the reverse of this newsletter.

Our programme includes, at 4:00pm, a speaker Zigi Shipper. In 1940 aged 10, Zigi Shipper was moved into the Łódź Ghetto where he remained until the its liquidation in 1944. He was sent to Auschwitz-Birkenau and then to Stutthof concentration camp near Danzig. With the Soviets advancing, Zigi and the rest of his group were sent on a death march. He was liberated on 3rd May 1945 and sent to a Displaced Persons' camp finally arriving in the UK in 1947, where he married and had a family. He now lives in Hertfordshire and regularly shares his testimony in schools across the country. In July 2017 Zigi Shipper returned to Stutthof concentration camp to share his story with the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge as part of their state visit to Germany and Poland.

Our programme also includes, at 5:30pm, a film: "But who could I pray for?" - The story of Abraham Aviel. Abraham Aviel is a Holocaust survivor from the village of Dowgalishok, then Poland (now Belarus) and the film is part of the "Witnesses and Education" series, a joint production of the International School for Holocaust Studies at Yad Vashem and the Centre for Multimedia Assisted Instruction of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. In this series, survivors recount their life stories-before, during and after the Holocaust. It was filmed on location where the events originally transpired. 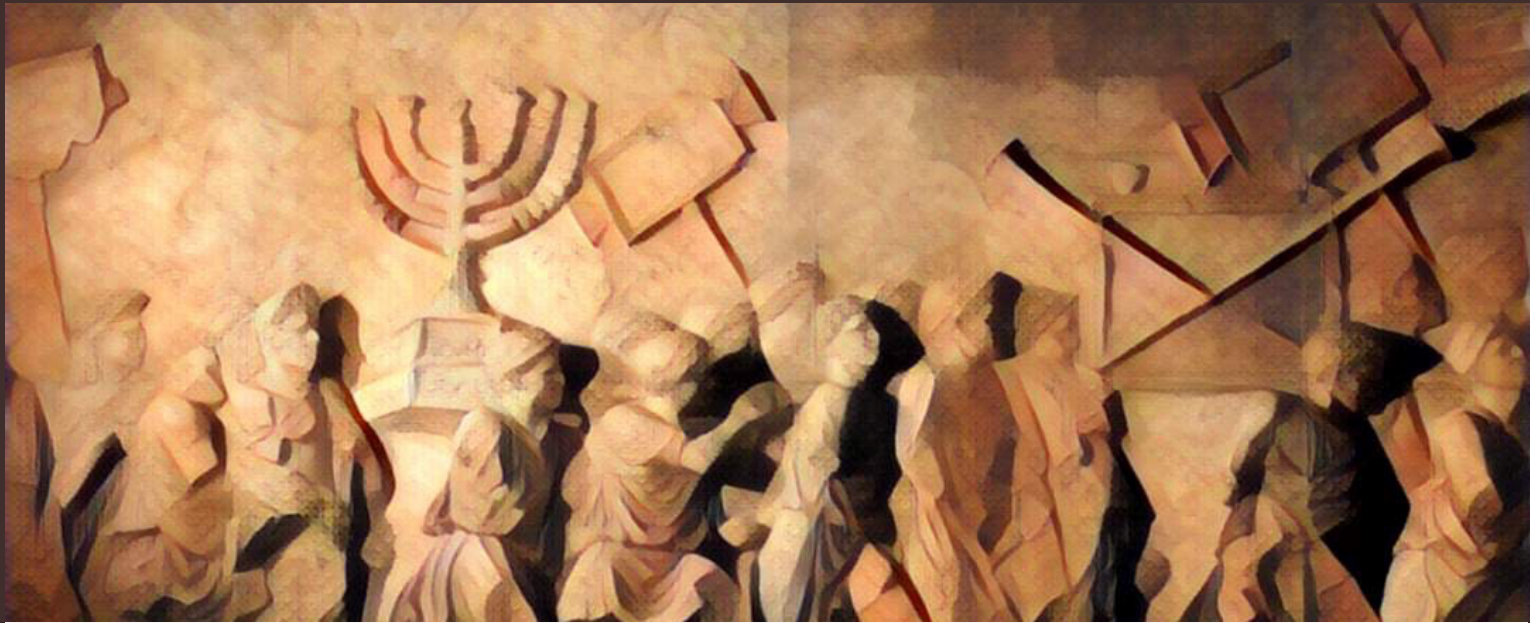
Shabbat Meals
