Yamim Noraim Booking

This year, services will be taking place in the Od Yosef Hai hall on Finchley Lane, Hendon. Prior booking is essential to guarantee your seat. Members of Magen Avot are eligible to apply for seats free of charge. Seats are also available for children of members under the age of 18 for a contribution of £18 per seat. Non-members are able to purchase seats at the cost of £100 for adults and £30 for children (under 18). Both members and non-members should submit their booking straight away. However, in order to give priority to members, we will be allocating seats first to members who have applied before Sunday 29th July. Any remaining seats will then be allocated to non-members who have applied before that date on a first-come first-served basis. We will of course make every effort to accommodate everyone who applies before the deadline as we have in previous years. Important note: members and non-members who apply after Sunday 29th July will not be allocated fixed seats but will be able to use an area of non-reserved seating on a first-come first-served basis. 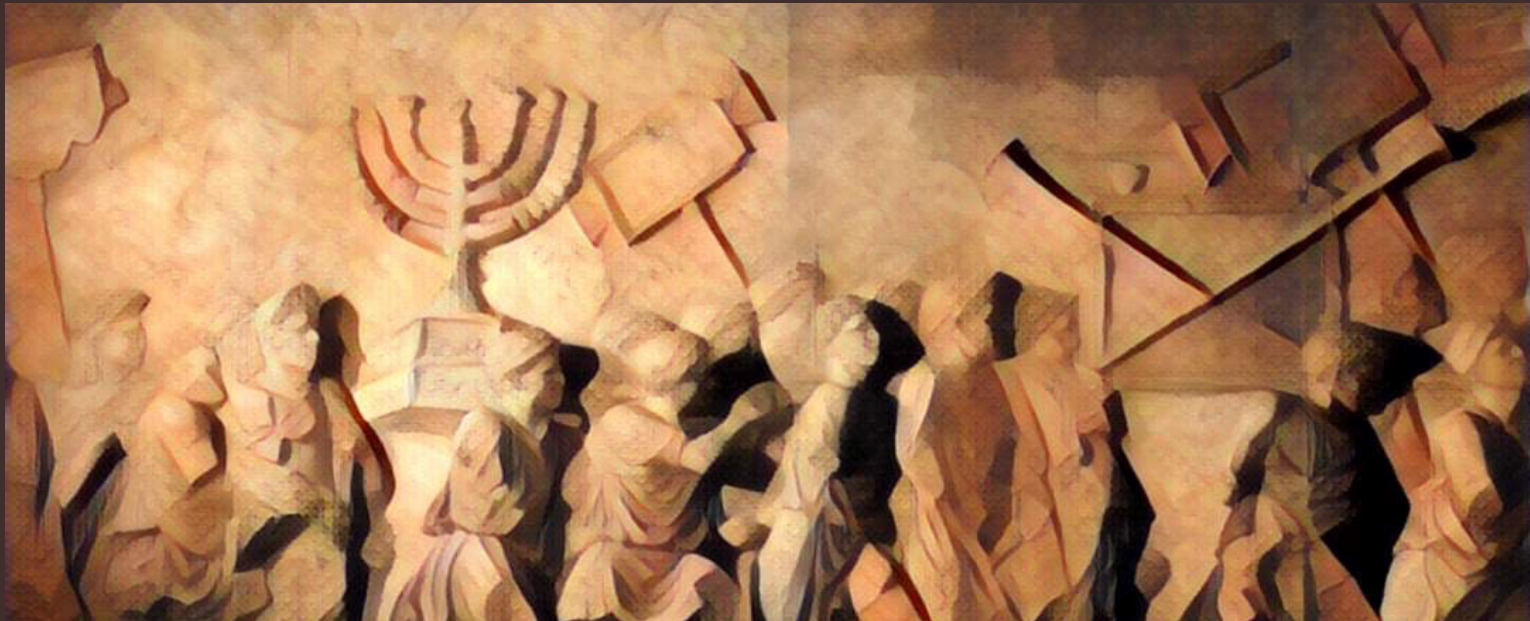
Sub-Committees

Zigi Shipper

ABOUT OUR SPEAKER

We are privileged to have a presentation by Zigi Shipper. In 1940 aged 10, Zigi Shipper was moved into the Łódź Ghetto where he remained until the its liquidation in 1944. He was sent to Auschwitz-Birkenau and then to Stutthof concentration camp near Danzig. With the Soviets advancing, Zigi and the rest of his group were sent on a death march. He was liberated on 3rd May 1945 and sent to a Displaced Persons' camp finally arriving in the UK in 1947, where he married and had a family. He now lives in Hertfordshire and regularly shares his testimony in schools across the country. In July 2017 Zigi Shipper returned to Stutthof concentration camp to share his story with the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge as part of their state visit to Germany and Poland.

The story of Abraham Aviel

Abraham Aviel is a Holocaust survivor from the village of Dowgalishok, then Poland (now Belarus) and the film is part of the "Witnesses and Education" series, a joint production of the International School for Holocaust Studies at Yad Vashem and the Centre for Multimedia Assisted Instruction of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. In this series, survivors recount their life stories- before, during and after the Holocaust. It was filmed on location where the events originally transpired.
