



<b>Guidelines and Timing</b>	s for Pesach (Rabbi Kenigsberg)			
Tuesday 7 April	Bedikat Chametz should be performed after 8.25pm followed by the declaration in the Haggadah.			
Wednesday 8 April	<ul> <li>In Shacharit, Mizmor leTodah and Lamenatzeach are omitted.</li> <li>Siyum for Firstborns will take place at 8.30am via livestream on the United Synagogue Faceboo Page (Please note you do not need to have a login to Facebook to access the livestream).</li> <li>Latest time to eat chametz is 10.49am.</li> <li>Latest time to own chametz is 11.56am. Any remaining chametz should be flushed down the toile or put in bins (rendered inedible with bleach if safe to do so) and placed off your property (see attached flyer on Page 3 and 4).</li> <li>The second Kol Chamira declaration fund in the Haggadah should be recited before this time.</li> <li>Matzah should not be eaten on Erev Pesach.</li> <li>Eiruv Tavshilin should be prepared, in order to allow preparations for Shabbat over Yom Tov.</li> </ul>			
Wednesday Night (Seder Night)	<ul> <li>Candle lighting should take place after 6.23pm and no later than 7.31pm.         (Remember to light a 2-day candle)</li> <li>Seder should not commence before nightfall at 8.28pm.</li> <li>Remember to follow carefully in the Machzor/Siddur as the Amidah and some other parts of davening differ from the standard Shabbat davening.</li> </ul>			
Thursday 9 April (1st day Pesach)	<ul> <li>Shacharit for Yom Tov is followed by full Hallel (Sof Zman Kriat Shema at 9.39am).</li> <li>Tefillat Tal which is recited on Pesach was only instituted when davening with a tzibur and not when davening alone. Therefore, one can recite it if they wish, but there is no obligation to do so.</li> <li>Mashiv HaRuach uMorid HaGeshem is recited in the Amidah in Mussaf for the final time. It is then omitted from Mincha onwards.</li> </ul>			
Thursday Night (Second Seder)	<ul> <li>No preparations can be made before second day Yom Tov commences at 8.36pm. Candles should be lit from a pre-existing flame from this time onwards, and only then can preparations be made for the second day and the Seder.</li> <li>Sefirat HaOmer is counted at the end of Ma'ariv.</li> </ul>			
Friday 10 April (2nd day Pesach)	<ul> <li>Shacharit for Yom Tov is followed by full Hallel (Sof Zman Kriat Shema at 9.38am).</li> <li>Shabbat candles should be lit not earlier than 6.24pm but before <b>7.34pm</b>.</li> <li>All necessary preparations for Shabbat such as cooking or heating up food on existing flames are permitted on Yom Tov but should be concluded before lighting Shabbat candles.</li> <li>An abridged Kabbalat Shabbat is said, as shown in the Matzorim.</li> <li>Ya'aleh V'Yavo is added in the Ma'ariv Amidah and is said throughout Chol HaMoed.</li> </ul>			
Shabbat Chol Hamoed 11 April	<ul> <li>Sof Zman Kriat Shema at 9.37am.</li> <li>Half Hallel is recited each day until the end of Pesach.</li> <li>Shir HaShirim is read in the morning.</li> <li>Regular Shabbat Mincha with Ya'aleh V'Yavo at the usual time at home.</li> <li>Shabbat ends at 8.40pm.</li> <li>Veten Bracha is recited in the Amidah in place of Veten Tal uMatar liVracha, and this continues throughout the coming months.</li> <li>Vihi Noam is not recited. Sefirat HaOmer is said at the end of Ma'ariv, and the usual Havdalah of Motzei Shabbat is recited. After making your own Havdalah at home please join us for a Communal Havdalah over zoom led by Rabbi Kenigsberg at 9.10pm. Login details will be posted to the Community Whatsapp Group after Shabbat.</li> </ul>			
Chol HaMoed	<ul> <li>In Shacharit, Mizmor leTodah and Lamenatzeach are omitted.</li> <li>Ya'aleh veYavo is said in the Amidah of all Tefillot (and Birkat HaMazon)</li> <li>Half Hallel is said at the end of Shacharit, followed by Mussaf.</li> <li>On Sunday and Monday we will be joining together over zoom for Shacharit at 8.00am followed by musical Hallel led by Alex Jacobs on Sunday and Daniel Greenberg on Monday.</li> <li>Whilst not a full Yom Tov, Chol HaMoed has an added level of Kedusha. It is therefore proper to wear Yom Tov clothes, celebrate with festive meals and dedicate extra time to Torah study, as one would do on Shabbat and Yom Tov.</li> <li>On Monday night Rabbi Kenigsberg will be giving a special shiur of Tzurba m'Rabanan entitled: "Pandemics in Halacha". The shiur will begin on zoom at 8.30pm.</li> </ul>			
Tuesday 14 April (Erev Yom Tov)	<ul> <li>Candle lighting should take place after 6.29pm and no later than <b>7.41pm</b>. (Remember to light a <b>2-day candle</b>).</li> <li>Shehecheyanu is not recited at candlelighting or at Kiddush on the 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> day of Pesach.</li> </ul>			
Wednesday 15 April (Shevi'l shel Pesach)	<ul> <li>Yom Tov Shacharit is followed by Half Hallel (Sof Zman Kriat Shema at 9.32am).</li> <li>No preparations for the eighth day may be made before nightfall at 8.47pm. Candles should be lit from a pre-existing flame from this time onwards.</li> </ul>			
Thursday 16 April (Shemini shel Pesach)	<ul> <li>Yom Tov Shacharit is followed by Half Hallel (Sof Zman Kriat Shema at 9.31am).</li> <li>Yizkor is recited.</li> <li>Yom Tov ends at 8.49pm. The introductory pesukim of Havdalah are omitted and only two berachot are said. Borei Pri HaGafen and HaMavdil (no besamim or eish).</li> <li>Please wait until 10.00pm before opening or using any chametz any chametz which was sold for the duration of Pesach.</li> </ul>
















# Collection arrangements are different from last year

## Pesach collection service 2020

A Pesach refuse service will be in operation at houses on 300+ pre-designated roads, making it simple for residents to dispose of Pesach refuse and Chometz before Passover.

The list of pre-designated roads is shown overleaf and also available to view at www.barnet.gov.uk/pesach-collection. For some residents who do not live on a designated road, we will be offering a pre-bookable collection service. Please check the road list overleaf to see whether your road is a pre-designated road, and then follow the relevant guidance below.

Please note that the council is working to minimise disruption to services during the COVID-19 outbreak, however these arrangements are subject to change and any updates will be available at www.barnet.gov.uk/pesach-collection

### Pre-designated roads

### If your normal refuse collection day is...

# Tuesday 7 April or Wednesday 8 April, your collection arrangements are as follows:

Your refuse bin collection will take place as scheduled. In addition to emptying your refuse bin, a maximum of three sacks of Pesach waste per household will be collected on your normal collection day.

Collections will take place from 6am from the boundary of your property.

#### If your normal refuse collection day is...

#### Thursday 9 April your collection arrangements are as follows:

Your refuse bin and a maximum of three sacks of Pesach waste per household will be collected on Tuesday 7 April.

Your normal refuse bin collection will also take place as scheduled on Thursday 9 April.

Collections will take place from 6am from the boundary of your property.

#### If your normal refuse collection day is...

#### Friday 10 April, your collection arrangements are as follows:

Your refuse bin and a maximum of three sacks of Pesach waste per household will be collected on Wednesday 8 April.

Your normal refuse bin collection will also take place as scheduled on Friday 10 April.

Collections will take place form 6am from the boundary of your property.

# Non-designated roads

Your refuse bin collection will take place as scheduled.

A pre-bookable collection of a maximum of three refuse sacks to take place on Wednesday 8 April can be requested by emailing pesach@barnet.gov.uk or calling 020 8359 4600 from 9am on Friday 27 March until 10am on Friday 3 April.

We will only collect your refuse sacks on this day, we will not be emptying your bin.

Collections will take place from 6am from the boundary of your property.

#### Handy tips to manage your Pesach waste

- Your normal refuse bin collection will take place on your scheduled collection day. Collections may take place at a different time of day than usual.
- Pesach waste that is not presented as set out above will not be collected.
- Please do not overfill refuse bins, as it may not be possible to collect these containers.
- Please do not place any excess food waste in your green garden waste bin or blue recycling bin. Food waste should be placed in your black refuse bin.

Whilst we aim to deliver Pesach collection arrangements as outlined above, please keep up to date on any changes to these collections which may occur in relation to the COVID-19 outbreak by visiting the Pesach web page below.
