The Missing Tefillin (continued)

So far..... The Tefillin are lost – they've been taken by the binmen and are now probably in a smelly, disgusting landfill! Mr Cohen has a plan. He races outside, hails a taxi and tells the driver: FOLLOW THAT DUSTCART! As fast as you can. The taxi driver gives him a strange look but drives as fast as he can after the dustcart.

Mr Cohen jumps out of the taxi, pays the driver and looks around frantically – just one ENORMOUS mountain of rubbish. He doesn't know where to start! He sees a small building where some bin men are drinking coffee so he races over to them.

"My tefillin, my tefillin, I need my tefillin!"

A big burly binman stands up: "What are tefillin? What do they look like? Have you seen the size of the mountain of rubbish? No one could find anything in there. Talk about a needle in a haystack! You'd better say goodbye to them forever and just get new whatever it is....."

"You don't understand! I have to get them back. They are holy! I use them every morning when I say my prayers! They're holy! They don't belong in a stinky smelly landfill". And poor Mr Cohen just bursts out crying.

"Ok, sir". I'm going to look for them!"

All his mates stare at him as if he is mad but our big burly binman marches off, onto the mountains of rubbish.

Half an hour later, Mr Cohen cannot believe his eyes! There they are! A bit dirty and a lot stinky but definitely his Tefillin. The binman hands them over with a big smile! Mr Cohen takes them and looks up at the binman, a huge smile on his face.

Message from the Magen Avot Project Restart Team with FAQs

We are delighted to announce the reopening of Magen Avot on July 24th.

Although the Government has confirmed that places of worship could reopen from 4th July, we are taking a cautious approach as we have to take into consideration the practical and safety issues connected with sharing our premises with the Nancy Reuben school. To that end, we have set up a "reopening task force" who have been working hard to ensure that we are protected and safe upon our return to shul.

In our preparations we have been advised by the Chief Rabbi and the United Synagogue. Their requirements for reopening are not optional, and thus all those members who wish to attend services are required to comply with these requirements. These may well change before our reopening date, and therefore we will be sending out further guidance and information nearer the time.

It is imperative that people who are experiencing symptoms of Covid-19 or have been in contact with anyone who has experienced symptoms of Covid-19 in the last 2 weeks, should not come to shul, due to the risk that they pose to others.

Older members and those that are clinically vulnerable should use their judgement to decide whether to attend services.

Regretfully, in line with current United Synagogue guidance, we are unable to allow children under 12 to attend services at this stage. We are, however, actively looking into alternative arrangements for children's activities, and we hope to release further details about these shortly.

We will be operating a booking system for all minyanim (Mincha and Kabbalat Shabbat, Shabbat morning, Shabbat Mincha and Ma'ariv and Sunday morning Shacharit). This is to comply with the Government track and trace requirements, and so that we can plan seating, based on demand. Priority will be given to those saying Kaddish, or with Yahrzeits or S'machot. Details about how to book will be sent out shortly, but only those who have booked, and received confirmation of their place will be able to attend the service they have chosen.

Please see the FAQs below, and should you have any further questions at this stage, Joy Kay will be happy to try and answer them.

PROJECT RESTART-FAQs

ATTENDING SERVICES

When is Magen Avot reopening for services?

We are planning to reopen on Friday July 24th, for Mincha and Kabbalat Shabbat. Before this date, we will have put in place our health and safety measures, along with risk assessment requirements.

Which services will be taking place?

Mincha and Kabbalat Shabbat, Shabbat morning, Shabbat Mincha and Ma'ariv and Sunday morning Shacharit.

Will there be restrictions on the number of people able to attend services?

Yes, as we are operating with 2 metre distancing.

How do I book to attend services?

If you cannot book online, please call Joy Kay on 07956 348392 who will assist you in booking.

Can I bring my children or grandchildren?

Unfortunately, no children under the age of 12 will be able to attend at present. This is in accordance with guidance received from the United Synagogue.

HEALTH ISSUES

Will I need to wear a face mask?

Yes. Everyone should bring their own face mask. We will have some disposable face masks for those unable to bring their own.

Will I need to wear gloves?

Only when handling the Sefer Torah. Gloves will be provided for those requiring them.

Can I sing in shul?

To minimize the risk of anyone unknowingly carrying and spreading the virus, only the person leading the services will be allowed to sing.

IN SHUL

Will I be able to use Magen Avot's siddurim and chumashim?

We would ask that you bring your own siddurim and chumashim. If you need the shul to lend you sefarim, please advise Joy ahead of time so that we can arrange for these to be made available to you.

Will there be any communal tallitot available for Aliyot?

No. These will not be available for attendees to use.

Can I kiss or touch the Sefer Torah?

No. This is not permissible at the moment.

Will there be hand sanitizer available?

Yes. There will be several hand sanitizer stations in the building.

Will I be able to use the toilets?

Yes. Only one person will be able to enter at a time.

I think I may have some symptoms of the virus, but it may just be a cold. Can I still attend services?

No. We ask that you follow Government guidelines and self-isolate for a period of 14 days.

Where can I put my coat?

There will be no hanging rail for coats and you will need to keep your coat with you at all times.

Will shul be cleaned between services?

Yes. Shul will be cleaned thoroughly between each service, with particular attention being paid to door handles, taps and other surfaces where there is constant use and contact.

DISTANCING AND CLEANING

What is the role of the "Minyan Ushers"?

They will assist with seating arrangements, check that all attendees are wearing face masks, and are compliant with social distancing.

Can I walk around in shul?

No. There will be a one-way entry and exit system in place. Once you are seated, you will not be able to walk around.

Can I sit in my usual place?

Seats will not be individually allocated, and you will need to check that you are socially distanced from other people.

Will there be a kiddush?

Sadly, not yet!

MA's Project Restart team very much hopes to be able to accommodate everyone who wishes to come to shul, but, as we have stated, our capacity is severely limited due to social distancing requirements. We are exploring the option of having 2 separate minyanim on a Shabbat morning, and possibly at other times, should there be a demand for it. More details to follow!
