

# Message from JWA

This Yom Kippur, we are honoured to be chosen as your charity for the Magen Avot Kol Nidrei Appeal. As we approach this time of contemplation, our thoughts turn towards those in need. The Jewish women and children we work with are some of the most at risk in our community. This year, we delivered 106 age-appropriate workshops and assemblies to 2,442 young people in mainly Jewish schools in London and Manchester.
