First Days Succot Guidelines by Rabbi Yoni Golker

- The earliest time for candle lighting on Friday is **5.30pm** and no later than **6.29pm**. A 2-day candle should also be lit (for candle lighting on Day 2).
- Kiddush should not take place before nightfall at **7.17pm**.
- If it is raining on first night Succot: If it seems the rain may stop, one should wait an hour or two for it to subside in order recite a full Kiddush and eat in the succah.
- However, if members of the household are hungry and/or tired and waiting will unduly the disturb the enjoyment of Yom Tov then one is not required to wait. In such a case or if the rain appears steady and likely to continue throughout the night, one should make Kiddush (without the bracha of Leishev baSuccah) and eat a k'zayis of bread in the succah. The rest of the meal can continue in the house.
- If one has an opportunity to eat in the succah after the rain stops, then it is preferable to return to the sukkah, recite the bracha of Leishev BaSuccah and eat a k'beitzah of bread.
- The four minim are **not** taken on the first day of Succot this year, as it falls on Shabbat.
- No work or preparation may be done for the second day before nightfall at **7.27pm**. Candles should also be lit from this time (but not before) from a pre-existing flame.
- Kiddush for the second night includes the brachot of Meorei Ha'Eish, Havdalah (from Shabbat to Yom Tov), Shehechevanu (there is no requirement to have a new fruit) and Leishev baSuccah.
- If it is raining on the second night one is not required to make Kiddush in the succah. However, if the rain stops it is proper to go and eat a k'beitzah of bread in the succah (and recite the bracha Leishev baSuccah).
- Yom Tov goes out on Sunday night at 7.25pm. Only the brachot of Borei Pri HaGafen and HaMavdil are said at Havdalah, which should be recited in the Succah.

Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah Guidelines by Rabbi Yoni Golker

- The earliest time for candle lighting on Friday is 5.17pm and no later than 6.10pm. The bracha concludes lehadlik ner shel Shabbat v'shel Yom Tov. Shehecheyanu is also recited. (Remember also to light a 2-day candle.)
- The meals of Shmini Atzeret should take place in the succah, however the bracha of Leishev BaSukkah is not recited. If it is raining, there is no requirement to wait or go into the succah and one may eat indoors.
- Megillat Kohelet is usually read on Shabbat Chol Hamoed Succot, and this year is pushed off to Shmini Atzeret (as there is no Shabbat Chol Hamoed). **Yizkor** is also recited on Shmini Atzeret. Tefillat Geshem is recited as part of Mussaf and from this point on משיב ומוריד הגשם said during the Amidah.

 No work/preparation for the 2nd day before nightfall at **7.12pm**. Candles should be lit from this time from a **pre-existing flame**. Kiddush for the second night includes the brachot of **Meorei Ha'Eish**, **Havdalah** (from Shabbat to Yom Tov) and **Shehecheyanu**
- (there is <u>no requirement</u> to have a new fruit).
- Yom Tov goes out on Sunday night at **7.09pm.** Only the brachot of *Borei Pri HaGafen* and *HaMavdil* are said at Havdalah.
- ותן ברכה is now said in the Amidah and we continue saying משיב הרוח ומוריד הגשם.
