Isle of Islay Whisky Tour 2024

We are planning another Whisky tour to Scotland this May. This time on the Isle of Islay off the West Coast of Scotland. The island boasts some of the most famous whisky distilleries and outstanding natural beauty with wildlife and deserted beaches. These places are best for points of interest & landmarks in Islay: American Monument, Dunyvaig Castle, Kildalton Cross, Finlaggan and Rhinns of Islay Lighthouse. The most famous distilleries include: Caol IIa, Laphroaig, Ardbeg, Bowmore, Bunnahabhain and Bruichladdich. Dates proposed are from Tuesday 7 May to Thursday 9 May (2 nights/3 days). Return flight details: Depart Luton Airport Tuesday 7 May at 8.50am for Glasgow Airport and return Thursday 9 May arriving at Luton at 4.55pm. Cost of flights: around £60 return. Food: As per our last trip we shall arrange kosher meals from Mark's Deli in Glasgow. Likely cost around £75 per head to include breakfast, packed lunches and evening dinner. Transport: we shall arrange a coach to and from Luton airport and also a coach for three days while in Scotland. Quotes are likely to be around £175 per person. Accommodation: We are investigating various hotel options as to availability and price. These include: Isle of Raasay Distillery Hotel, No 1 Charlotte Street Hotel, The Royal at Portree and Skye Picture House. Costs vary from ~£75/pp/per night to £150 per night depending on location, rating and availability. Once we have a clear idea about numbers of members who may be interested we can seek group discounts. As a young adult she lived a year in England to learn the language and teach French. After that she came back to France but never stopped travelling. She visited every continent and lived many adventures.


She married twice until she found Mr Right. She leaves her husband, 2 children and 4 grandchildren behind.


Unfortunately, she was diagnosed with ALS 4 years ago. Although she suffered greatly at the end she was surrounded by a lot of love and care from her family and friends.
