NEXT BOOK CLUB



The Magen Avot Book Club meets again on **Monday 17 March** at **8.00pm** when we will review "Three Floors Up" by *Eshkol Nevo*.

New members welcome!

Three Floors Up by Eshkol Nevo is a fascinating story about three different people who live in the same apartment building near Tel Aviv. Each person lives on a different floor and shares their thoughts and feelings with someone in their own unique way.

On the first floor, Arnon is a father who loves his family very much, but he worries a lot about his young daughter. He becomes so anxious that he starts making decisions without thinking, which causes tension with his wife. To help himself, he reaches out to an old friend and tells his story over dinner.

On the second floor, Hani is a mother who spends a lot of time alone with her two children because her husband travels often for work. She feels lonely and uncertain about things happening in her life. Since she has no one nearby to talk to, she writes a long letter to a close friend in another country, hoping it will help her understand her feelings.

On the third floor, Devorah, a retired judge, is adjusting to life on her own after losing her husband. She had once followed strict rules, but now she decides to join a group of young people in the city who are speaking up about important issues. Feeling inspired, she records messages on an old answering machine, as if speaking to her late husband, to share her thoughts about her new experiences.

Each character is facing a big change in their life, and as the book moves up the floors, their stories slowly find a sense of resolution. This thoughtful and engaging novel explores how people deal with challenges and how important it is to share our thoughts with others.

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
